


# **Funding Mission & Ministry in Morton 2023**

## **Funding Mission & Ministry in Morton**

#### 1. Who we are and What we do?

#### We are **People who worship**

- We have Sunday morning services every week, and Sunday evening services once a month
- Morning Prayer on Mondays
- Choir Practice every week and regular concerts
- We have started a new Worship Band
- Special Services at Christmas and Easter etc
- We offer Baptisms, Marriages, Funerals



## We are **People who witness**

- Collective Worship in East Morton
  Primary School every week, including
  "Open the Book" in school every 2 weeks
- We host Visits to church from school every term
- We take a service at Morton Close every fortnight
- We run a Bible Study Group, Lent Groups
- We deliver Leaflets to all residents at Christmas
- We communicate online through our Website and social media

## We are People who serve

- We help run Morton Meet
- We run Coffee Mornings every month
- We Provide space for the community
- We organise a Children's Holiday Club in summer
- We host Community Events, Concerts etc
- Hospital visiting and Home Communion
- Churchyard Working Parties



## We are **People who give**

We support Christian Ministry for all

- Parish Share (pays for our clergy)
- African Pastors Fellowship



We support relief and development agencies

• Disasters Emergency Committee (Ukraine) We support local and national charities

 Children's Society, Christian Links in Keighley Schools, Project 6, Zephaniah Trust



#### 2. What does it all cost?

Last year our Expenditure amounted to £69,600

But our Receipts only amounted to £54,000. We defaulted on the amount we pay for our clergy (the "Parish Share") by £13,000 (37% of Share requested)

#### 3. Our Vision for 2023 is to

- · Pay Parish Share in full
- Carry out repairs to church building (mainly roof and bells)
- Raise funds and purchase the rest of the chairs for the church
- Increase our mission and ministry by reaching out to children and families in our community
- Recruit new givers to replace those who have died or are no longer able to give



· Get grant funding for new kitchen, toilets and lighting



## 6. Why do we give?
